Fund objective and strategy

SICAV IDF is an actively managed open ended daily dealing UCITS V Luxembourg registered fund. The Fund seeks to generate positive, measurable environmental and/or social impact, aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals, alongside a total return, by investing in Emerging Market transferable debt securities and related instruments. The Fund follows a best ideas approach across Hard Currency EM debt, focussed mainly on Corporates and Impact Bonds. Non-USD denominated assets will be hedged back into USD. All the Fund's investments – except those intended for hedging, liquidity or assets being disposed – will be Impact Investments. While the Fund references the benchmark for performance comparison, it can differ from the benchmark's composition and also hold assets which are not part of the benchmark. 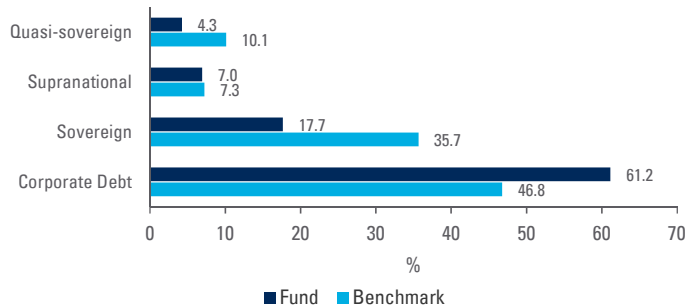

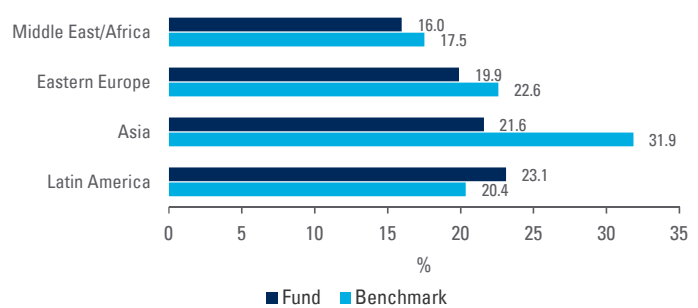
