Fund objective and strategy

The Fund seeks to achieve its objective by investing principally in debt instruments of Sovereigns and Quasi-Sovereigns of EM Countries and EM Supra-Nationals denominated principally in Hard Currencies (i.e., the U.S. dollar or any currency of a nation in the G-7). The Fund has no restrictions on individual security duration and observes a policy to normally invest at least 80% of its net assets (plus borrowings made for investment purposes) in bonds and other debt instruments of Sovereign or Quasi-Sovereign issuers of Emerging Market Countries and EM Supra-Nationals.

Effective August 1, 2023, the JP Morgan Emerging Markets Bond Index Global Diversified will replace the JP Morgan CEMBI BD Investment Grade Index as the primary benchmark for Ashmore Emerging Markets Investment Grade Income Fund because Ashmore believes the JP Morgan Emerging Markets Bond Index Global Diversified is a more appropriate broad based securities market index representing the universe of securities in which the Fund may invest.

²JP Morgan CEMBI Broad Diversified consists of an investable universe of corporate bonds and tracks total returns of U.S. dollar-denominated debt instruments issued by corporate entities in Emerging Markets countries. The JPM CEMBI BD IG Index is a sub-index which contains instruments that carry an investment grade rating. You cannot invest directly in an index.

Yield to maturity: Average anticipated rate of return for the portfolio's positions if held to maturity.

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About credit quality: Credit quality ratings are sourced from Standard & Poor's (the "S&P"), Moody's and Fitch's and based on issuers with ratings. Ratings values are based on the middle of three rating agencies S&P, Moody's and Fitch. If only two of the ratings are available then the lower rating of the two will be used. If none of the rating agencies have assigned a rating the Fund will assign a rating of NR (non-rated security). The ratings represent the agencies (S&P, Moody's, Fitch's) opinions as to the quality of the securities they rate. The ratings range from AAA (S&P, Fitch's) or Aaa (Moody's) (extremely strong capacity to meet its financial commitment) to D (S&P, Fitch's) or C (Moody's) (in default). Ratings are relative and subjective and are not absolute standards of quality. The ratings provided relate to the underlying securities within the fund and not the fund itself.
