
#### Fund objective and strategy



#### 5. Definitions



#### Definitions

Fund Weight: The percentage of fund net assets represented by the position.Benchmark: A financial index against which the performance of a fund or investment strategy can be measured.Benchmark Weight: The percentage of the benchmark represented by the position.Active Weight: The difference between the fund weight and the benchmark weight in the position.

Attribution analysis:

Asset Allocation: refers to the contribution to fund performance relative to the benchmark that is derived from differences in country exposure between the fund and the benchmark. Security Selection: refers to the contribution to fund performance relative to the benchmark that is derived from the selection of individual securities. Total: is the total attribution for the fund and combines Asset allocation and Security selection decisions.

Stock Attribution Total: refers to the contribution to fund performance resulting from stock exposure relative to the performance of the local country market in the benchmark.
